PROGRAM

COMPLETION TIME

The **Massage Fundamentals Program** is 450 hours of class time and 50 hours of clinical internship contact time for 500 hrs total.

Not including scheduled holidays and breaks, the *projected* completion time frames are 8-9 months for evenings & weekend track and 7-8 months for weekday classes.

The **Massage Mastery Program** is 450 hours of class time and 200 hours of clinical internship contact time for 650 hours total.

Not including scheduled holidays and breaks. the *projected* completion time frames are 9-10 months for evenings with weekend classes and 8-9 months for weekday classes.

***Internship** completion for both programs is contingent upon normal massage clinic business operation appointments and appointment cancellation factors for both programs. Internship hours consist of actual massage therapy contact hours of services to clients, not clock hours. The internship may extend past projected completion dates.

Once enrolled, your enrollment agreement will outline *projected* start and completion dates with the above internship contingency in mind. The selected program at the time of your enrollment will reflect the financial responsibility to that respective program.

INSTRUCTOR TO STUDENT RATIO

We've chosen to limit our enrollment to a limited number of students for hands-on classes. Why? Because we want to provide near one-on-one instruction. Our focus and dedication are on your training and an unparalleled learning experience.

The student/instructor ratio is limited to 4-6 students to 1 instructor for hands-on instruction.

The student/instructor ratio will vary for lecture/online and/or in-person lecture courses.

ANATOMY & PHYSIOLOGY

ANATOMY 50-hrs AND PHYSIOLOGY 25-hrs 75 HRS TOTAL

This course will introduce the students to the structure and function of the human body and all body systems including the following areas: bones, joints and muscles, the skin, blood and blood vessels, cells, tissues and membranes, the heart, the brain, spinal cord and nerves, the lymphatic system, the digestive system, the respiratory system, the urinary system, the reproductive system, glands and hormones in addition to the normal vital processes of the human body including the processes of cells, tissues, and organs including the contractibility of muscle tissue; coordination through the nervous system; digestion; circulatory; reproduction; and secretions. This course is taught online.

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. Identify body organization.
2. Identify and explain body systems and their functions.
3. Locate the basic landmarks on bony prominences.
4. Locate superficial muscles.

HEALTH & HYGIENE

HEALTH AND HYGIENE 20-HRS

In Health and Hygiene, the student will learn safety and sanitary practices as applied in massage therapy healthcare settings by using universal precautions. Topics include hand-washing techniques, infections, sterilization, virus, and bacteria. The student will be introduced to health and wellness strategies beneficial to Massage Therapists including exercise/physical fitness and wellness models that will be implemented and developed throughout the entire program. CPR and First Aid for Adults, Children, and Infants are also part of this course. In addition, the student will explore the dynamics of human relationships critical to massage therapy. This course is taught in person.

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. Identify and implement universal precautions.
2. Explain the basics of contamination and cross-contamination.
3. Have completed a course in CPR and First Aid
4. List the different agents used to disinfect massage equipment.
5. Implement wellness and exercise models.
6. Utilize skills important to positive human interactions.

THERAPEUTIC MASSAGE I

THERAPEUTIC MASSAGE I 125-HRS

In this course, the student will be introduced to the fundamental theory and practice of therapeutic massage. Students will also learn to identify the indications, contraindications, benefits, and effects of massage along with identifying and applying therapeutic massage techniques. Students will gain perspectives on health care and explore the diverse population of clients that can be encountered including geriatric, prenatal, pediatric, and clients with special needs. Competence will be measured by hands-on skills, professional conduct, and communication along with knowledge in the theory and practice of massage therapy. Proper draping technique, body mechanics, range of motion, and therapeutic exercise will be carried throughout the program to develop good sound practices habits. This course requires the student's full participation in serving as a model and receiving therapeutic massage, as well as serving as a student therapist by applying and providing massage therapy techniques without exception or limitations. Learning and working with the human anatomy requires all students to completely disrobe (with proper draping) while serving as models to allow for a "real world" learning experience. Safe and proper draping is utilized at all times during hands-on practical application. This Course is taught in person.

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. Apply proper draping techniques.
2. List and define the 6 fundamental strokes (techniques) used in Swedish massage.
3. Apply fundamental therapeutic massage techniques.
4. Perform range of motion on every movable joint.
5. List indications and contraindications for massage.
6. Identify diverse populations of clients in healthcare settings.

PATHOLOGY

DISEASE PROCESS

PATHOLOGY 40-HRS

During this course, students will explore the causes and nature of disease and its effects on the structure and functioning of the human body.

By gaining solid fundamental knowledge in this area, the student will be able to identify situations where massage therapy may be indicated and contraindicated. This is a critical skill all massage therapists must develop to ensure proper and safe applications of massage therapy protocols amongst diverse populations of clients. This course is taught online with possible hybrid dates for student presentations.

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. Identify and explain how pathological processes affect the practice of massage therapy.
2. Identify and explain the pathologies of the different systems of the anatomy.
3. Make informed decisions on massage therapy protocols.
4. Communicate with the other health care providers.

HYDRO THERAPY

HYDROTHERAPY 20-HRS

Hydrotherapy is the use of water in three forms; liquid, solid, and vapor. The student will gain a theoretical understanding as well as hands-on skills by applying a variety of modalities such as ice massage, hot packs, and other thermo-based treatments and protocols. Students will also learn the contraindications of hydrotherapy and the different areas of its use. This course requires the student's full participation in serving as a model and receiving therapeutic massage, as well as serving as a student therapist by applying and providing hydrotherapy modalities in conjunction with massage therapy techniques without exception or limitations. Learning and working with the human anatomy requires all students to completely disrobe (with proper draping) while serving as a model to allow for a "real world" learning experience. Safe and proper draping is utilized at all times during hands-on practical application. This course is taught

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. Define cryotherapy and thermotherapy.
2. Understand the indication and contraindication of hot and cold applications.
3. Demonstrate the safe use of steam and all related temperatures.
4. Demonstrate the safe use of other heat-based therapies.

THERAPEUTIC MASSAGE II

THERAPUTIC MASSAGE II 75-HRS

By continuing to build on Swedish massage skills, during this course, the student will begin using a superior level of massage therapy. By applying techniques, body mechanics, and table mechanics used in therapeutic deep pressure/deep tissue applications, the student will gain a higher level of skill and knowledge. Students will also explore the fundamentals of pain patterns, deep tissue muscle constrictions, and myofascial dysfunction. Hydrotherapy modalities previously learned will continue to be utilized. Students will also be introduced to chair massage and chair massage applications. This course requires the student's full participation in serving as a model and receiving therapeutic massage, as well as serving as a student therapist by applying and providing massage therapy techniques without exception or limitations. Learning and working with the human anatomy requires all students to completely disrobe (with proper draping) while serving as a model to allow for a "real world" learning experience. Safe and proper draping is utilized at all times during hands-on practical application. This course is taught on campus.

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. Identify and use proper body mechanics for deep-pressure massage.
2. Use elevated massage skills for a more therapeutic approach.
3. Explain the fundamentals of pain patterns and myofascial dysfunction.
4. Perform basic chair massage techniques and explain settings where chair massage is utilized.

KINESIOLOGY

MECHANICS & MOTION

KINESIOLOGY - 50 HRS

Kinesiology is the study of the mechanics of motion with respect to human anatomy. During this course, the student will take a closer look at joints and muscles, along with examining how muscles contract and levers function. The student will also be introduced to musculoskeletal assessment, the role of the nervous system, posture, and the gait cycle. Muscle contraction, movement, and correct terminology are at the core of this course. This course is presented in a hybrid format with both online and in person dates.

Upon completing this course the student will be able to:

1. Describe the physiology and category of joints.
2. List the joints of the axial body.
3. Describe the structure and function of skeletal muscle tissue.
4. Explain the different contractions of muscles.
5. List and define the major roles of muscles.
6. Describe movement using anatomical terms

BUSINESS AND ETHICS

BUSINESS AND ETHICS - 45 HRS

This course introduces the student to basic business, management, marketing and start-up strategies. Employment, contract and self employed principles are also discussed. In addition, this course covers ethical standards of the massage therapy industry as well as the rules and regulations as set by the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation.

Upon completing this course the student will be able to:

1. Identify basic business designations with marketing and startup strategies.
2. Identify professional and ethical standards as they apply to the massage therapy industry.
3. Identify and explain the rules and regulations that govern the massage therapy industry as set by the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation.

CLINICAL INTERNSHIP I & II

CLINICAL INTERNSHIP

50 HRS FUNDAMENTALS PROGRAM / 200 HRS MASTERY PROGRAM

The Clinical Internship is the point where students will be placed in a real-world setting providing massage therapy services for the general public. Each student will be required to complete a total of fifty (50) hands-on hours for the Massage Fundamentals program and two hundred (200) hands-on hours for the Massage Mastery program respectively. The benefit of the Massage Mastery program is the training continues in the area that matters the most: hands-on practice and skills. Students are required to maintain their working areas in a clean, organized, and sanitized manner including classrooms, treatment rooms, equipment, supply areas, and linens/towels closet. Because this course requires the student to provide massage services to the general public, exceptional levels of attendance, safety, professionalism, and technical skills are required to successfully complete this course. An instructor(s) is available on-site at all times during the clinical internship and all classroom instruction.

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. Confidently provide a variety of therapeutic massage services.
2. Work with a diverse population of clients.
3. Better develop hands-on and office/business skills needed to successfully practice massage therapy competitively and effectively.

INTERNSHIP

DETAILS

The internship provides the students the opportunity to apply their acquired knowledge and skills in a supervised and guided “real world” clinical learning environment before graduation. The internship is scheduled during the internship's respective class time. In addition, internship schedules are made available outside of regularly scheduled class times but will not interfere with other scheduled courses on a different topic. Students will be attending classes and completing internship hours concurrently. Taking advantage of all internship hours may help ensure projected program completion dates.

Students must make personal arrangements to attend assigned internship schedules. This ensures that students have ample time to complete their internship training requirements as needed. It is the student’s responsibility to complete their internship training using all options available, including hours outside of regularly scheduled class time.

Due to the nature of the internship portion of the program, clients depend on student professionalism and attendance. Students who accumulate more than one late arrival or absence to a scheduled internship date or appointment start time will face disciplinary action resulting in a suspension, up to termination, and will be handled on a case-by-case basis. This is applicable whether or not the student had an actual client scheduled on the date(s) or time(s) of the incident. Walk-in clients may become available requiring the timely presence of the student. Students will receive credit for **hands-on time completed**, not clock hours.

INTERNSHIP

CONT'D

Students will go through a mandatory internship orientation prior to starting the internship. The Massage Therapy Internship is a requirement for completion of the program for all students enrolled in the Massage Therapy Program, unless exempt by the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation due to previous internship completion at another approved school or institution. All credit assessed for courses is only approved by the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation. All transcripts are reviewed by the school director for tuition purposes only. Please see Transfer Credit Section.

A student must successfully complete the first 250 hours of the supervised course of instruction, including the successful completion of at least 100 hours of massage therapy techniques and theory, before the student is eligible to enter the internship program.

TECHNICAL STANDARDS & ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy's program of Massage Therapy has established technical standards and essential functions for the program. The following technical standards and essential functions listed below include but are not limited to, required competencies for completion of the program. The ability to meet these standards and essential functions, with or without reasonable accommodation, is required in order to complete the program satisfactorily. Please review the following technical standards and essential functions carefully.

1. The ability to understand course materials and maintain a certain grade/performance level that meets the set academic requirements.
2. The ability to maintain a professional demeanor at all times and interact professionally with fellow students, internship clients, administration, and faculty.
3. The ability to adhere to a professional dress code acceptable to the profession and as set by Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy.
4. The ability to carry, move and adjust a massage table and massage chair without assistance.
5. The ability to assist clients and patients in clinical settings in getting on and off tables and other therapeutic areas without limitation.
6. The ability to use both upper limbs to perform bodywork for extended periods of time.
7. Sufficient manual dexterity to perform various clinical and classroom requirements for the different types of massage techniques taught in the program.
8. Sufficient flexibility to bend, stretch, twist, or reach with your body, arms, and/or legs.

TECHNICAL STANDARDS CONT'D.

9. The ability to stand as required to perform manual massage techniques for a sustained duration of time, up to 4-7 hours per day. Students should be able to apply sustained industry-standard levels of pressure using thumbs, wrists, fingers, forearms, and hands for up to 2 hours at a time with no breaks.

10. The ability to provide and receive light therapeutic and deep tissue massage sports massage and all modalities included in the training, including working or laying on a therapeutic table in both prone and supine position, for a period no less than 1 hour, and up to 2 hours without limitation.

11. The ability to provide, receive and participate in thermo/cryo (heat/ice) and hydro (water) based therapy treatments (i.e. hot packs, ice packs, infrared sauna, thermo-wraps, steam, contrasts, therapeutic body wraps).

12. The ability to perform light to medium-low impact cardiac and strength-building exercise

13. Because massage therapy is a health care service and learning is done using the human body, the student must be able to participate in all areas of training, including but not limited to receiving massage therapy services in clinical settings. Please be advised, this involves disrobing and receiving massage services from fellow students while covered with professional massage therapy draping. Students will be required to work on clients of all genders without discrimination or limitations.

TECHNICAL STANDARDS CONT'D.

14. The ability to record client histories, provide routine safety instructions, and conduct a safe and professional massage session with little or no supervision.

15. The ability to implement sanitation standards along with Universal Precautions in health care.

16. The ability to type and use computers and technology at more than a basic level.

Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy does not discriminate in admission or access to programs on the basis of any characteristic protected by law, including disability. Persons with disabilities are eligible for admission, as long as, they can carry out the classroom, laboratory, and clinical assignments including client intake, assessment, and delivery of massage therapy techniques as taught and assigned, or the equivalent; pass written, oral, and practical examinations; and meet all of the requirements of the program and generally accepted requirements of the profession, with or without reasonable accommodation.

ADMISSIONS & ENROLLMENT

The admissions and enrollment process begins with an application and is followed by an interview with a school representative. The purpose of the interview is to:

1. Explore the prospective student's background interest as it relates to the programs offered at Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy;
2. Assist prospective students in identifying the appropriate program of study consistent with their background and interest;
3. Provide information including but not limited to, curriculum, clinical internship, tuition, payments, and services available at Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy.
4. Because we offer limited enrollment,

Prospective students will tour our facility as part of the enrollment process and fill out the necessary forms and documents. Arrangements for an interview and tour of Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy may be made by contacting a school representative.

Admissions Requirements

To be eligible for admission into our massage therapy licensing program, a prospective student must have a high school diploma or equivalency certificate (GED) recognized by the United States Department of Education and must be 18 years of age at the time of enrollment. A valid government-issued ID is also required. Classes are taught in English; therefore, an adequate level of proficiency in reading, writing, and speaking the English Language is required.

Programs taught in Spanish require the same proficiency in that language.

EXAMS REQUIRED

Massage Therapist National Licensing Exam

To obtain a Texas massage therapist license, TDLR requires a passing score on either the

- Massage and Bodywork Licensing Examination (MBLEX) which is administered by the Federation of State Massage Therapy Boards (FSMTB) **and** a passing score on the TDLR Juris Prudence Examination. *See below**

OR

- The TDLR Texas Massage Therapist Examination which is administered by TDLR vendor PSI. Applicants who take the TDLR State of Texas-administered exam *will not* have to sit for the Texas jurisprudence exam because the law and rules topics are part of the examination.

The Texas Massage Therapist Jurisprudence Examination content is based on the state rules and laws relating to the practice of massage therapy. All applicants for initial licensure must submit proof of completing the jurisprudence examination at the time they submit a completed application form (Apply Online or see Texas Massage Therapist License Application PDF). Applicable fees are paid directly to the third-party vendor for the jurisprudence examination.

FINGERPRINT REQUIREMENT

All massage therapy licensing applicants require individuals to submit for fingerprinting.

After submitting your licensing application, you must be fingerprinted for a national criminal history record review before a license may be issued. This is a one-time requirement, and TDLR will be notified of any arrests or criminal convictions that occur after you are fingerprinted.

CRIMINAL BACKGROUND & LICENSING / TDLR

Applicants with Criminal Convictions

If you have ever been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor (other than a minor traffic violation) or pleaded guilty or no contest (resulting in a deferred adjudication) to any in-state, out-of-state, or federal criminal offense, you must provide a completed Criminal History Questionnaire (PDF) along with your application materials available on the TDLR Massage Therapy website.

Criminal convictions are reviewed on a case-by-case basis. Licenses may be denied based on the nature of the conviction and how long prior to the application the conviction occurred. Depending on your criminal history, a review can take from **one to six weeks to complete**.

This process and approval must be completed and notice received from TDLR prior to enrollment.

NOTICE

1. A person is ineligible for licensure if the person has been convicted of, entered a plea of nolo contendere or guilty to, or received deferred adjudication to crimes or offenses under Chapter 20A, Penal Code, or Subchapter A, Chapter 43, Penal Code, or another sexual offense.

ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS

In order to ensure students complete their program in a timely manner and to better prepare students for a successful career, it is essential that absenteeism and tardiness be kept to an absolute minimum. Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy strives to enforce attendance policies that require students to regularly and punctually attend class. We start on time!

ABSENCES AND LATE ARRIVALS

All absences and tardiness are recorded regardless of the reason. A full day of absence will be marked when a student does not attend any of the scheduled classes on that day. A partial day of absence will be marked for any period of absence during the day.

The massage program will evaluate each student's attendance at the end of each course. In cases of excessive absenteeism or tardiness, the massage program may take disciplinary action prior to the end of a course.

An absence shall be charged for a full day when a student attends none of the scheduled class(es) that day. A partial day of absence shall be charged for any period of absence during the day.

Students who miss more than 15% of a course will be placed on attendance probation for the following course. A student missing over 15% of a course during the probationary period may be terminated from the massage program. Students who fall below 15% during the first course of their program will be dropped due to not meeting the cumulative attendance percentage requirements. Additionally, a student is at risk of being terminated when their absences exceed 15% of the total cumulative hours in the program. Authorized Leaves of Absence (LOA) will not be included in the attendance percentage of a course.

ATTENDANCE

REQUIREMENTS CONT'D

Any student who is absent ten (10) consecutive days without an approved leave of absence will automatically be terminated.

Except for a documented leave of absence, a school shall terminate a student who does not attend a massage school for thirty (30) school days.

Any student who is terminated for unsatisfactory attendance may not re-enter the massage program before the start of the next course, and will only be readmitted if the factor(s) contributing to the poor attendance has been resolved to the massage program's satisfaction. A student who was terminated for violating the attendance policy and is readmitted will be placed on attendance probation for a minimum of one course.

Students missing 30% of an entire course will be required to repay for and retake the course in its entirety. Students entering the classroom after the initial attendance is recorded will be charged an hour for being tardy. Students returning from break late will also be marked as absent for the hour(s) missed. Standard hourly tuition rates will be applied.

Holidays and scheduled annual breaks are not considered days of absence.

MAKE-UP TIME

POLICIES & FEES

At its discretion, the massage program may allow a student, who for reasons acceptable to the massage program, is experiencing non-repetitive, extreme attendance problems, to make up essential *coursework/assignments* missed due to absenteeism. In the event that a student misses a significant amount of hours in a course, the instructor may determine that's in the best interest of the student to repeat the entire course.

Make-up work shall not be authorized for the purpose of removing an absence. All make-up hand's on instruction time required shall be completed no later than five (5) days following the date of the absence or the date on which the student returns to the massage program. and shall not interfere with regularly scheduled class time. Failure to make up the time within the allotted time frame will affect the student's "Professionalism" final grade for that grading period. Late arrivals to class will constitute an absence for the number of hours missed. There are no grace periods.

It is the student's responsibility to contact their instructor to request and arrange for any make-up work and make-up instruction.

Students missing more than 15% of an entire course will be required to take the course in its entirety. The course may be taken upon availability and respective hourly tuition will be applied.

There is a non-refundable \$25/hour fee for the make-up instruction time that must be paid at the time of scheduling

MAKE-UP TIME

POLICIES CONT'D

All make-up work must:

1. Be approved by the Instructor and department Program Director.
2. Be supervised by an instructor approved to teach the subject matter being made up.
3. Require the student to demonstrate the same level of knowledge and competence expected of a student who attended the scheduled class session.
4. Be completed no later than five (5) days following the date of the absence or the date on which the student returns to the massage program.
5. Be documented by the instructor as being completed. The documentation should include the date, time, and duration of the make-up session, as well as the name of the supervising instructor.
6. Be signed and dated by the student and the instructor to acknowledge the make-up session.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

A leave of absence (LOA) is a temporary interruption in a student's program of study and should only be requested in extenuating circumstances and emergencies including but not limited to; medical reasons, military service, or jury duty. All requests for an LOA must be submitted in writing and must be both signed and dated. Written requests for leaves of absence shall include the reason for the request and the amount of time needed. All LOAs must have prior approval by the Program Director.

A leave of absence for reasonable purposes acceptable to the massage school:

- Shall not exceed the lesser of thirty (30) school days or sixty (60) calendar days.
- Shall be granted only one leave of absence for each 12-month period.
- If the student fails to return from leave, the student will be automatically terminated and any applicable refunds will be made in accordance with TDLR's refund policy. The effective date of termination shall be the last day of the leave of absence.

Students who are on an approved LOA, not exceeding more than 30% of their current course, will have time to make up missed coursework. If an LOA exceeds 30% of the student's course, it will be left to the discretion of the Program Director whether the student may attempt to complete the required make-up work and challenge the course exam for credit. If the Program Director does not approve such an attempt or if the student fails to pass the challenge exam, the student will be required to retake the course in its entirety. This is based on space, schedule availability, and requires respective hourly rate tuition fees.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE CONT'D

Due to the sequential nature and prerequisites of many of the courses in each respective program, students may be required to return to the same point in their studies in which they began their LOA or retake a course respective of hours missed for that particular course.

Retaking a course may affect the student's graduation date and is contingent depend on course schedules.

Students on an LOA remain in Active Status; therefore, they are still obligated to maintain payments due to Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy.

In order to graduate, a student's accumulative absences (including Leaves of Absence) must not exceed 15% of the total program hours.

REQUIRED

FULL PARTICIPATION

Massage Therapy is a healthcare service, which requires working with the human body. During my training, you will be required to serve as a student therapist and as a model/client, as well as give and receive a therapeutic massage.

This program requires that you work with the human body, and you will be required to participate while being fully and/or partially disrobed, but properly draped (covered), when serving as a model/client as directed by instructors and topics being covered.

You will be working with classmates and clients of all genders, and I will be required to rotate learning partners as directed without discrimination or limitations of any kind. Students unable to meet this requirement for any reason or who violate safety and/or professional ethical rules and/or program policies will be terminated from the program.

You must be able to meet all of the technical standards of the program. If your health/physical status presents changes that may put your or fellow student's health at risk, or limits your ability to fully participate as a student therapist or model/client and receive all modalities as taught in the program and meet the technical standards, as well as be graded/evaluated, you will be asked to take a leave of absence or be dropped from the program until such time that you are able to return to the program at 100% participation and meet all technical standards. This includes students presenting contraindications to any and all modalities.

During uring Health and Hygiene and Sports Massage course, you will be required to participate in mild to moderate, low-impact physical exercise. It is your responsibility to seek medical attention and clearance for any pre-existing injuries or physical limitations.

STUDENT CONDUCT POLICIES

All massage therapy students are required to exercise professional conduct as described in the Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy Student Catalog and Handbook. Due to the nature of the Massage Therapy program, all massage therapy students must also adhere to the following conduct standards which include, but are not limited to following:

- The student shall not make comments or jokes of a deviant and/or sexual nature.
- The student shall not make comments or jokes, whether complimentary or derogatory about any other student, faculty, or staff member, or any other employee or massage client, guest, or visitor of Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy and adjacent offices.
- Because Massage Therapy is a health care service, and students train using the human body, the student shall refer to the human body in a professional manner using proper terminology. The student shall also refrain from making comments of any kind in reference to the physical status and or appearance whether complimentary or derogatory about any other student, faculty or staff member, or any other employee of Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy, or internship clients.
- Students shall use confidentiality standards in accordance with professional healthcare environments about other students and/or internship clients.
- Students shall not engage in abusive language or behavior towards any fellow students, staff, faculty, or guests/clients of Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy or adjacent offices and visitors.
- Students shall not engage in violent behavior or racial, political, and/or gender-discriminatory practices.
- Students who violate any of these conduct policies are subject to disciplinary action which can result in suspension up to termination.

STUDENT

CONDUCT POLICIES 2

Any violation of Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy policies & standards, including safety violations, abusive language, drinking or illegal use of drugs (on or off campus), school or fellow classmate's theft or any other unlawful acts may result in suspension or termination. Improper conduct off campus and or during field trips may also result in suspension or termination incurring respective make-up time fees or hourly tuition fees.

Students are required to follow school policies and standards while attending Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy. It is the student's responsibility to conduct themselves in a proper and respectable manner while attending the massage program.

Any student who fails to comply with the conduct standards and policies as published on the Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy catalog may be subject to a verbal or written reprimand, probation, suspension, or termination from Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy depending on the nature and severity of the violation. Re-admittance following such termination is at the discretion of the massage program and relative to the nature and severity of the conduct violation. Students should immediately report any conduct violations to their instructor or other school representatives.

WITHDRAWALS

DROPS & CANCELS

If a student should choose to withdraw from the program for any reason before the completion of their training, the student is required to inform Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy in writing. Notification must be delivered to the massage program director prior to withdrawing.

DROP & TERMINATION / READMITTANCE

Students who have withdrawn or have been terminated for violation of the school policies and standards, attendance, financial or academic issues may request consideration for re-admittance by writing a letter to the School Director specifically explaining the following:

1. What variables prevented them from maintaining satisfactory attendance, academic requirements or adhering to the Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy policies and standards?
2. What has been done to correct the issue(s)?
3. What can the massage program expect from the individual if allowed to return?

In addition, the student must be able to demonstrate that they have the financial resources to complete the program. Re-admittance is not a guarantee.

Cancels: This pertains to a student canceling the enrollment agreement within 72 hours (until midnight of the school's third business day excluding business closed and legal holidays) after the enrollment contract is signed by the prospective student. If tuition is collected in advance of the first day of the program, and if, after the expiration of the 72-hour cancellation privilege, the student does not enter the program, an administrative fee of no more than \$200 will be assessed and deducted from the respective refund.

APPEALS

FOR TERMINATIONS

Depending on the nature and severity of a situation, student(s) may be terminated due to a violation of Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy rules including, but not limited to, theft, academic dishonesty, illegal drug or alcohol use, inappropriate behavior, or behavior that jeopardizes the safety of others, and academic or attendance issues.

A student has the right to appeal a decision if they have been terminated from the massage program. The appeal must be submitted in writing to the School Director or student services within 10 calendar days of the date of termination. Once the appeal letter is received a panel may be assembled to hear the appeal. The student(s) will be notified in writing of the appeals panel decision within five (5) days. Re-admittance or re-enrollment is not guaranteed.

GRADING

& STUDENT PROGRESS

Upon completion of each course, all students will receive a progress report to evaluate academic progress. All coursework must be satisfactorily completed to be eligible for graduation.

Students earning a grade of 59 or below will be required to retake that course as space allows. Students may retake only one lecture course. The hourly tuition rate will apply.

Students who accumulate a total of two failed courses will be dropped from the program due to Unsatisfactory Academic Progress. Students who are dropped from the program for unsatisfactory progress may re-enroll in the program with approval from an instructor and program director. Re-enrollment is not a guarantee and is contingent upon the student demonstrating they have corrected any issues that were preventing them from meeting academic requirements. Students may also be placed on probation for the next grading period.

TESTS

QUIZZES & PRESENTATIONS

Pop quizzes or "open book tests" missed due to absence may not be made up. The student will receive a "zero" for a grade.

Closed Book Tests missed due to absence may be made up the day the student returns to class. A final grade will be issued minus a 10-point deduction.

Presentations missed to due absence may be made up the day the student returns to class. A final grade will be assessed minus a 10-point deduction.

Closed-book tests and individual or group presentations are scheduled and notice is provided on your course syllabus.

TRANSCRIPTS & RECORDS

Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy shall maintain student transcripts of academic records permanently and shall issue one set of transcripts to students upon graduation if the student has fulfilled their financial obligation to Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy respective to their enrollment agreement and program. Additional original or certified copies of transcripts (official transcripts) shall be available to students and any person authorized by the student for a \$10.00 fee per copy *if the student has fulfilled their financial obligation to Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy*. Transcripts will be made available to students who have satisfied the terms of the enrollment agreement within ten (10) calendar days of the date the terms are satisfied.

Students must provide the school in writing, the names of any persons authorized to request and obtain records on the student's behalf.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

You can pay for your tuition using one of our payment options:

1. In one lump sum payment via credit/debit card or cashier's check or

REFUND POLICIES

Tuition at Rejuvenate School of Massage Therapy is calculated at an hourly rate and the programs are administratively divided into quarters. For all qualifying refunds, the school will use the following TDLR rule to ensure refunds are made as prescribed by TDLR.
